I'm adding a question that might be in your area as well:</p> <p>I have an organization that is considering using the DEEL P3 grant to build capacity in BIPOC dualas. This is not a direct services but rather to bring business acumen to this community with a long view to increase culturally competent dualas in the African American community.</p> <p>My general take on this approach is that while interesting, is it a bit out of scope from the ask. Not inherently non responsive, but my concern would be that the raters might not see the connections and it wouldn't be competitive next to a stack of proposals that can more easily show direct impact.</p> <p>Would you agree or add to this either way?</p>	<p><b>Answer(s):</b> The proposal as described would not be eligible for this funding opportunity. 9	<p><b>Question(s):</b> Hi DEEL,</p> <p>I'm wondering if you can provide clarification on the difference between the "Leveraged Funding" and "Other Funding or In-Kind" columns on the budget template? Is there a specific definition for what types of funding sources should be reflected in the "Leveraged Funding" column?</p> <p>Also, if we want to apply for the whole \$298,000 funding amount for two years, I'm assuming we should just put the total 2-year cost for each line in our budget template - and that we don't need to indicate or separate out which costs belong to Year 1 versus Year 2?</p> <p>Thanks for your help!</p>	<p><b>Answer(s):</b> It is not required to split by year on this template. Proposal funding is what amount from DEEL you are applying for with this grant opportunity. Leveraged funding is related to other fund sources you are using to pay for the expenditure (i.e., other grants).
