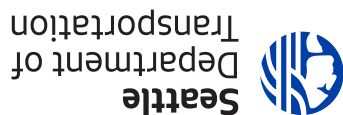
A NEIGHBORHOOD GREENWAY IS COMING TO YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD!

The following street improvements on NE 117th St from 15th Ave NE to 25th Ave NE and 25th Ave NE from NE 117th St to NE 125th St will begin as soon as spring 2024:

- All-way stop signs installed at the intersection of NE 117th St and 25th Ave NE
- Stop signs with stop bars on side streets intersecting the Neighborhood Greenway
- Tree trimming and sidewalk smoothing
- Wayfinding signs and markings
- Speed humps or cushions to calm traffic

We are excited to announce that we are **starting construction on the Pinehurst Neighborhood Greenway on NE 117th St and 25th Ave NE as soon as spring 2024!** We will be installing the Neighborhood Greenway in stages, starting this spring and finishing in 2024.

There will be “no parking” signs along this street due to construction of speed humps and staging. **Please move your vehicles during the “no parking” timeframes, otherwise they will be towed.**



Overview

The Pinehurst Neighborhood Greenway will provide a safer, calmer route to the places people want to go in the neighborhood and connect to the growing network of Neighborhood Greenways, trails, and protected bike lanes in Seattle. This Neighborhood Greenway has been planned in coordination with the Safe Routes to School Program and will provide a safer, more comfortable route for people walking and biking to Hazel Wolf K-8 STEM School. The planned Neighborhood Greenway route also connects to the existing Neighborhood Greenway on NE 117th St.

WHAT IS A NEIGHBORHOOD GREENWAY?

Neighborhood Greenways are safer, calmer residential streets for you, your family, and neighbors. We make people walking and biking the priority. The design elements of Neighborhood Greenways include speed humps, stop signs for side streets crossing the greenway, crossing improvements, and wayfinding signs and markings.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION:

Typical construction hours are weekdays, 7 AM to 5 PM, with occasional weekend and night work. Other expected construction effects may include:

- Temporary driveway impacts
- Noise and vibration
- Dust and debris
- Construction staging and parking impacts near the work sites
- Parking impacts
- Crosswalk and sidewalk closures, and detours for people walking and biking
- Roadway closures and detours for vehicle traffic
- Changes in construction schedule due to unforeseen circumstances (i.e., weather, soil conditions, etc.)
