



Vine Basin CSO Control Project

Project goal

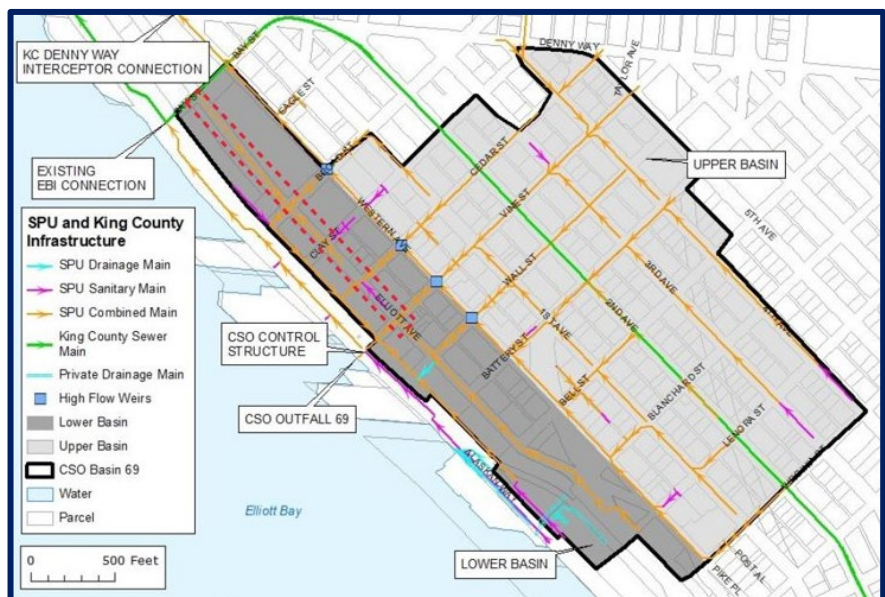
The Vine Basin CSO Control project looks to address/control the combined sewer system flows in the Vine Basin (CSO Outfall #69) to reduce CSO's in Elliott Bay. The preferred option selected for system improvements includes a partnering solution with King County by redirecting flow to the County's nearby Elliott Bay Interceptor sewer pipe via a new gravity sewer pipe with the associated access and diversion structures.

Project location

Vine Basin is in the Belltown neighborhood of downtown Seattle. The preferred route for the proposed collection system improvements is along Elliott Ave from Vine St to Bay St. This is approximately four blocks, or 1,800 feet.
